Provides comprehen- sive services to children from birth to three years old and pregnant women. What Is Head Start?



- Head Start is a federally funded educational program providing comprehensive child development services to eligible children & families
- At no cost, enrolled children & families receive educational, health, nutritional, social, and other services that prepare them for kindergarten and beyond



Head Start's approach to school readiness means:
 children are ready for school
 families are ready to support their children's learning
 schools are ready for children





Countywide Head Start Referrals

- LACOE's online Head Start Agency Referral System connects families to their local program, regardless of grantee
- More than a third of calls to 1-877-PRE-K-KID, LACOE's longstanding toll-free referral line, are referred to other grantees
- LACOE and the Department of Children & Family Services developed a system that refers foster children directly to their local Head Start grantee or delegate agency based on place of residence







CA Preschool Instructional Network

California Preschool Instructional Network supports educators through regional communities of practice and professional learning experiences that are research-based, developmentally appropriate, and promote quality





Quality Start Los Angeles

Quality Start Los Angeles (QSLA) is LA's countywide Quality Improvement System (QIS) designed to empower early learning providers to build upon and improve the quality of care they provide to children ages birth to five

Universal Prekindergarten


Through Universal Prekindergarten Planning & Implementation, LACOE supports local educational agencies in planning and implementing a mixed delivery universal prekindergarten system
