WHAT IS THE FACILITY FEE WAIVER PROGRAM?

The LA County Office for the Advancement of Early Care and Education (OAECE), in partnership with the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, is offering facility fee waivers for renovation or construction projects for child care facilities that need plan reviews and/or permits.



DO I NEED A PLAN REVIEW OR PERMIT?

Child care providers who want to renovate and/or construct a child care facility must contact the LA County Department of Regional Planning and LA County Department of Public Works, Building and Safety Division to determine if the project will need a plan review and/or permit. The child care provider should also contact CDSS Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) to confirm infant/toddler licensing requirements.

AM I ELIGIBLE FOR THE CHILD CARE FACILITY FEE WAIVER?

SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must serve infant and toddlers (ages birth-3) at the child care facility and provide a CA Department of Social Services, CCLD Infant/Toddler license.



LOCATION REQUIREMENTS

Facility must be located in Unincorporated Los Angeles County, and cities of Artesia, Carson, Cerritos, Industry, Irwindale, La Canada Flintridge, La Mirada, Lakewood, Lawndale, Lomita, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, Santa Fe Springs, or Westlake Village.
