# Question 11. Welfare and Institute Code (WIC) 10485-10487 Involvement in Local Priority Setting Process

#### **Finding - Compliant:**

- Local Funding Priorities report was presented to CCPC on 4/5/23.
- CCPC voted to approve the report on 5/3/23.
- The Local Funding Priorities report for the fiscal year 2022-23 was submitted to CDSS and CDE on 5/25/23.

# **Question 14. WIC Section 10485 Governance and Administration Finding - Compliant:**

- CCPC conducted a comprehensive Needs Assessment in 2022.
- The data included the Early Learning Needs Assessment Tool, the Child Care Alliance of LA, resource and referral agencies, alternative payment program agencies, the California Child Care Resource & Referral Network, the Los Angeles County Office of Education, US Census Bureau, as well as various state and county departments.
- On 12/7/22 the Need Assessment was approved by CCPC.

- The OAECE, acting on behalf of the CCPC, provides technical support and guidance to early care and education programs seeking assistance in harnessing the data effectively.

# Question 20. WIC Section 10486 (b)(1)(K)(2)(3)(4)(5)(7)(9)(10)(c)(d) Standards, Assessment, and Accountability

#### **Finding - Compliant:**

- The CCPC has formal Policies and Procedures to govern membership recruitment and selection which align with the prescribed standards for membership.
  - The Governance Work Group assembled a slate of 50 prospective members, comprising 23 returning members and 27 new additions.
  - On June 7, 2023, the CCPC approved the FY 23-24 membership slate.
  - The **membership was certified** by the Los Angeles County Superintendent of Schools and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors authorized representative, as well as the LPC Chair on **August 31, 2023**.



# Question 23.WIC Section 10485 (2)(g) Staffing and Professional Development Finding - Compliant:

- The CCPC adheres to a formal process for selecting its Chair and Vice Chair, in accordance with the established Policies and Procedures. The current Chair and Vice Chair were officially appointed on June 6, 2023.
- On September 7, 2022, an orientation was conducted for new members.
- During the fiscal year 2022-23, the LPC was directed to support integration of the ECE Mixed Delivery System into Universal PreKindergarten.
- The CCPC was designated as Los Angeles Counties UPK Work Group.

# Page 14 – "RECRUITMENT OF CHILD CARE PLANNING COMMITTEE MEMBERS"

 The language "Work Group" has been revised to "Subcommittee" or "Ad hoc" to ensure compliance with the Brown Act.

### Page 15 – "ALTERNATES"

- Proposal to revise "she/he" and "his/her" to "they/their" to use gender neutral language.
- Added the word "Subcommittee" and "Ad hoc" as the CCPC may establish Subcommittee(s) and Ad hoc(s) per Brown Act.

### Page 17 – "SUBCOMMITTEE OR AD HOC PARTICIPATION"

 Revised Subcommittee and Ad hoc language to describe the differences between the two and remain compliant with Brown Act.

## Page 18 – "ROLE OF SUCOMMITTEE(S) AND AD HOC(S)"

 Proposed revised language to indicate that all Subcommittee and Ad hoc recommendations must be brought to the Child Care Planning Committee General Meeting as action items for a vote/approval.

#### Page 20

- "VOTING ON MOTIONS" - Prior language indicates that the Vice Chair may only call a vote if the Chair is absent. The proposed addition in language allows the Vice Chair to call a vote when the Chair is absent or present.

#### - "MEETINGS HELD IN-PERSON AND BY TELECONFERENCE"

- Changes were made to retain procedures in the case general meetings need to be held via teleconference upon the issuance of an Executive Order of the Governor due to a public health emergency.
- "Staff Selection" Per Los Angeles County Human Resources, remove
   "Staff Selection" section as the practice is not permitted.




# **LA County ECE Roadmap**

# What is Transitional Kindergarten (TK)

- 2021 California legislation requires any local educational agency operating a Kindergarten to also provide a Transitional Kindergarten (TK) program for all 4-year-old children
- Must be implemented by 2025–26.

# What is Universal PreKindergarten?

- New umbrella term for all California early education programs for 3- and 4-year-old children
- Includes California State Preschool Program (CSPP), Transitional Kindergarten (TK), Head Start, etc.

# **Mixed Delivery Grant**

- Lead-OAECE (Local Planning Council)
- Focus on ECE Mixed Delivery System
- Allowable Costs with CDE grant
  - Coordinate with LACOE
  - Form a single local Work Group
  - Plan for UPK in mixed delivery system
  - Plan for increasing inclusion of children with exceptional needs
  - Plan for workforce development
  - Provide outreach services and enrollment support
  - Partner with tribes
