EXECUTIVE ORDER N-2-25

WHEREAS on January 7, 2025, I proclaimed a State of Emergency to exist in Los Angeles and Ventura Counties due to the Palisades Fire and windstorm conditions; and

WHEREAS the Palisades Fire has burned over 15,000 acres and additional fires have ignited and spread rapidly in Los Angeles County as a result of those windstorm conditions, including the Eaton, Hurst, Lidia, and Woodley Fires; and

WHEREAS these Los Angeles County fires and windstorm conditions continue to threaten structures, homes, and critical infrastructure, with over 170,000 residents under evacuation orders in Los Angeles County; and

WHEREAS these Los Angeles County fires and windstorm conditions have resulted in poor air quality and significant impacts to schools, including school closures and limited outdoor physical education; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8571, I find that strict compliance with various statutes and regulations specified in this Order would prevent, hinder, or delay the mitigation of the effects of these Los Angeles County fires and windstorm conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with the authority vested in me by the State Constitution and statutes, including the California Emergency Services Act, and in particular, Government Code section 8567, 8571, and 8627, do hereby issue the following Order to become effective immediately.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The provisions of Unemployment Insurance Code section 1253 imposing a one-week waiting period for unemployment insurance applicants are suspended as to all applicants who are unemployed as a direct result of this emergency in Los Angeles County and apply for unemployment insurance benefits during the time period beginning January 7, 2025, and ending on the close of business on July 7, 2025, in Los Angeles County and who are otherwise eligible for unemployment insurance benefits.
2. Vehicle Code sections 9265(a), 9867, 14901, 14902, and 15255.2, requiring the imposition of fees, are suspended with regard to any request for replacement of an identification card, driver's license card, vehicle registration certificate, or certificate of title, or registration stickers, by any individual who loses such records as a result of this emergency in Los Angeles County. Such records shall be replaced without charge.
3. The provisions of Vehicle Code sections 4602 and 5902, requiring the timely registration or transfer of title, are suspended with regard to any registration or transfer of title by any individual who is unable to comply with those requirements as a result of this emergency in Los Angeles County. The time covered by this suspension shall not be included in calculating any late penalty pursuant to Vehicle Code section 9554.



Executive Order

EXECUTIVE ORDER N-3-25

Executive Order to bolster the emergency response to the rapid spread of additional fires throughout Los Angeles and Ventura Counties due to the windstorm conditions.

EXECUTIVE ORDER N-3-25

WHEREAS on January 7, 2025, I proclaimed a State of Emergency to exist in Los Angeles and Ventura Counties due to the Palisades Fire and windstorm conditions; and

WHEREAS on January 8, 2025, I issued an Executive Order to bolster the emergency response to the rapid spread of additional fires throughout Los Angeles and Ventura Counties due to the windstorm conditions; and

WHEREAS these fires and windstorm conditions have collectively burned over 30,000 acres; and

WHEREAS these fires and windstorm conditions have destroyed and continue to threaten structures, homes, and critical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS these fires and windstorm conditions continue to evolve, requiring additional resources and personnel for the response efforts, including resources from outside of the State; and

WHEREAS these fires and windstorm conditions continue to result in poor air quality and significant impact to schools, including school closures, limited outdoor physical education, and overall impacts to school administration; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8571, I find that strict compliance with various statutes and regulations specified in this Order would prevent, hinder, or delay the mitigation of the effects of these fires and windstorm conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with the authority vested in me by the State Constitution and statutes, including the California Emergency Services Act, and in particular, Government Code section 8567, 8571, and 8627, do hereby issue the following Order to become effective immediately.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. All provisions contained in the above-referenced Proclamation of a State of Emergency and Executive Order shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified in this Order.
2. Any personnel holding a license, certificate, or other permit issued by a state party to the Emergency Management Assistance Compact, including, but not limited to, medical personnel, entering California to assist in responding to this emergency shall be deemed licensed, certified, or permitted to provide services in California as prescribed by Government Code section 179.5. Permission for any such individual rendering service is subject to the approval of the Director of the Emergency Medical Services Authority for medical personnel, or the Director of the Office of Emergency Services for non-medical

Payment to Two Providers

- The CDSS will waive state requirements to allow payment to two providers to reimburse both a new provider and the provider who has closed due to the wildfires as intended by Executive Order N 3-25 and is engaging with federal partners as necessary.
- The CDSS is asking agencies to pay both providers, the closed provider and the new provider during this 30-day period.
- The CDSS will publish in a Child Care Bulletin.

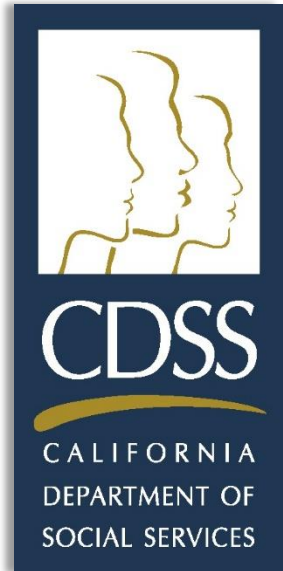
